- •BINA project started in 2006 as a week-long event, and during these 10 years has grown into a month-long festival. BINA is a platform which promotes contemporary architecture in the broadest sense, networking among the professionals and encourages interdisciplinary cultural exchange.
- •Belgrade International Architecture Week BINA was created under the auspices of two organizations: one NGO Association of Belgrade Architects and the Cultural Center of Belgrade, a city cultural institution. Since its founding, BINA has partnered with more then 400 local and international institutions, organizations and individuals.
- •BINA is a festival with very diverse types of events: exhibitions, lectures, debates, conferences, workshops for children, themed architectural walks, film program and performances ... with up to 17,000 visitors (data from 2015)






