






Why is this theme important

Crisis Management and Security of the Citizen Workshop Edinburgh 2013

- > 70 experts
- > 175 proposals
- > 150 community of interest, now CoU of EC

Outcome:

- need for semantic interoperability;
- need for guidance in crisis response planning and resilience;
- improve operational efficiency.
